


Superintendent's Message

What's Happening...

High School Knowledge Bowl had another successful season this year. Over 60 students



participated from grades 9 through 12. There are three local meets held in November, December and January, at which all the students competed. Two teams went to the regional meet in February and another team went to the state meet that was held in Arlington, WA on March 23. The team competed well, but was unable to make it to the semi-final round. State team members include captain Tyson Lovell, Tim St. Onge, Marcus Gettman, Cody Olsen, Nathan Nussbaum, Joseph Pellegrino and Christian Hamblin. Students compete to answer questions from the entire breadth of the high school curriculum. School Testing has Begun...

MSP Testing has begun! All schools in the state are required to test third through eighth grade students utilizing the Measurement of Student Progress (MSP). Beacon's third grade students will be taking the test on May 7th and May 8th in the morning on both of these days. Students will be taking tests in reading and math. Simpson school began testing on April 25th. As these are required tests, it is important for students to be at school on time, well rested, and have eaten breakfast. The results of the tests are used in part to gauge the success of school programs. The individual students results are also available in the fall on the district website. Various levels of the MSP are given in third through eighth grades. Students will take tests in reading, math and writing. Beginning in the tenth grade, students will take the High School Proficiency Exam. Also with the HSPE, high school students will take a variety of end of course (EOC) examinations. Passing these standards based tests are required to graduate high school. Additional information is available on the district website or you may contact the schools directly.

Teacher Training Days ...

Teachers around the state are facing new challenges with the new teacher and principal evaluation project and common core state standards. Due to new state requirements, these changes will go into effect over the next few years. Montesano's teachers and administrators are on task to implement this new program. Training is a key component to make this transition go smoothly. The 2013-2014 school calendar is currently being reviewed by our teaching staff to determine when these training days will take place. The calendar will then be presented to the school board at the May meeting for final approval. The current draft posted on the district's website reflects the standard school calendar days, early release days and school holidays. The changes we might see will be the last day of school as training days may be added at the end of the school year.

Montesano Welcomes Exchange Students...

Montesano families have opened their homes to host foreign exchange students this school year. Dr. Lori Blanchard, area representative of the ASSE introduced the exchange students during a school district board meeting in April. The students shared some experiences they've had so far in Montesano and the United States. It was evident their experiences have been positive and they feel fortunate to have the opportunity to be a part of the Montesano community. Dr. Blanchard shared that our host families have given them a 'second family' and it's an experience that changes your life forever. The students are, Kirsi Savolainen from Finland, Ariadna Almenova from Khazakhstan, Gurgen Khasapetyan from Armenia, and Nini Kurdadze from Georgia.

Early Childhood Intervention Programs...

The Montesano School District provides early intervention services beginning at birth up to the age of 5 for children who can be identified as having developmental delays or have a medical condition that has a high probability of resulting in a developmental delay.

The free services assist your child in five developmental areas:

- **Physical** (ability to move, see and hear)
- **Cognitive** (ability to learn and understand)
- **Communication** (ability to understand language and express needs)
- **Social or emotional** (ability to play and relate with others)
- **Adaptive** (ability to dress, eat, and take care of oneself)

Staff providing services include early intervention specialists, physical therapists, speech therapists and occupational therapists.

Services for children from birth to third birthday are provided by home or childcare visitors, depending on where children spend the majority of their time.

Qualifying children aged 3 are serviced in a two day a week preschool class. Transportation is provided. Placement can occur throughout the school year.

Qualifying children aged 4 are serviced in either a two or four day a week preschool class, depending on needs. Transportation is provided. Placement can occur throughout the school year.

Appointments for screening can be made at any time during the school year.



If you have any concerns about your child or want to see how they are developing compared to typical children of the same age, please call Karen at 249.2114 to set up a screening.

It's time for Preschool and Kindergarten Registration...

Preschool and kindergarten registration for the 2013-2014 school year is currently underway at Beacon. Beacon Elementary is also accepting registrations for new students in first through third grades during this open enrollment week. Registration for new students in grades four through six may be completed at Simpson Elementary. A legal birth certificate and a current immunization record are required at the time of registration for all students.


To be eligible for preschool, a student must be four years of age prior to September 1, 2013. Community preschool tuition is \$76 per month. A sliding fee scale is available. Limited ECEAP spaces are also available at no cost if income eligibility guidelines are met.

To be eligible for kindergarten, a student must be five years of age prior to September 1, 2013. Half -day kindergarten sessions are offered at no cost. The morning session is 8:20 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. The afternoon session is 11:50 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. Midday bus transportation is not available for kindergarten students. Full-day kindergarten is offered for an annual tuition of \$2,250. A monthly payment plan is available. The full-day kindergarten class is limited to 23 students.

If more students register for community preschool or full-day kindergarten than there are available spots, students will be selected by lottery. To be eligible for the lottery, all completed forms and information must be submitted by the end of the open enrollment period.

Registration may be completed at Beacon Elementary between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Registration forms may also be printed from our website at www.monteschools.org/beaconelementary.

Getting firm counts of the number of students who will be attending is an important part of planning for next year. The school can plan for staffing as well as order adequate supplies and materials. If you have any questions regarding registration, contact the Beacon Elementary office at 249-4528.
